Dacia, now owned by the French Renault, will have these models made in the northern African country, according to French daily Le Monde.

The new car plant in Algeria is estimated to produce 50,000 units to enter the local market.

Romania sold a number of 17,327 cars to Algeria in 2009, 84,708 to Germany, 65,956 to France, and 21,739 to Italy.

The new factory, which is to be owned 49% by Renault, will be built in Rouiba, close to Algerian capital.
